

**Argument:**

Introduction – Metaphor, Anecdote (to be addressed throughout)

Background – Classify Argument, Example

Thesis – Answering Prompt

Concessions – Address your Classifications

Rebuttal – Comparison-Contrast

Conclusion – Re-State Thesis, Present Sides, Ultimate Lesson

**Analysis:**

Speaker – Who is it? Describe approach (didactic, conversational, formal)

Occasion – Why they write? Describe technique (ELPS)

Audience – Who are they writing to? Describe primary/secondary audience

Purpose – What does author want? (persuade, inform, entertain)

Subject – How does the issue relate, at large?

**Free Write:**

Introduction: Metaphor, Classification, Thesis

1 – Thorough Deductive Response Paragraph (following process)

Answer Prompt:

Claim # 1 (proof, interpretation)

Claim #2 (proof, interpretation)

Claim #3 (proof, interpretation)

Correlation to Global Perspective (outside sources)

Lesson (related to metaphor/tone)

**Conclusion:**

Start with analogy (related to metaphor) or metaphor from beginning
